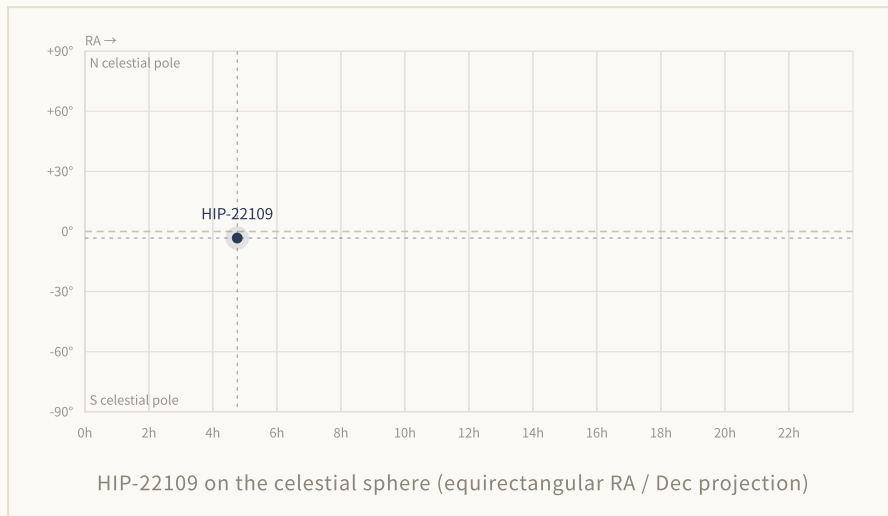

HOW TO VERIFY THIS YOURSELF

1. Look up HIP 22109 in the SIMBAD astronomical database (<https://simbad.cds.unistra.fr/simbad/sim-id?Ident=HIP+22109>) and confirm the star exists and that the right ascension, declination and magnitude on this certificate match it.
2. Open the permanent link <https://www.star.org/s/vwv6j0320q/> — the claim number on that page matches this certificate.
3. Search the star identifier HIP-22109 in the public registry <https://www.star.org/registry/>. Exactly one record should come back; if the same star appears twice, the registry is inconsistent and we would like to hear about it.
4. Claim records are stored as text files under `data/registrations/` in the public repository, readable by anyone without an account.
